Dear Senator Bailey:

The Commissioners of St. Mary's County support Senate Bill 290. This legislation alters the definition of "cottage food product" to include nonhazardous food, as specified in regulations adopted by the Maryland Department of Health, that is sold in the State in accordance with certain provisions of law and regulations adopted by the Department to retail food stores, including a grocery store, or food cooperatives.

We also request you consider amending Page 2, Line 4, to increase the annual revenues from the sale of cottage food products in an amount not exceeding \$25,000 to \$40,000 which is consistent with the Maryland On Farm Home Processing License.

The cottage food provisions in the Maryland Department of Health Code are a stepping stone for many entrepreneurs. Through our local farmers markets, we have seen individuals start as a cottage food business out of their home and expand into successful value added businesses.

We appreciate your support of this legislation and believe this legislation will benefit the citizens of St. Mary's County. We look forward to working with you on this and other initiatives throughout the session.
