# ADA COORDINATOR REPORT -

Ms. Bishop stated that she received a waiver request from the Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development. The applicant, a builder, is requesting a waiver from the Maryland Code that there must be one accessible residential unit in a building with five or more units. The applicant purchased a property within the Town of Leonardtown and plans to renovate the building. The current property includes commercial space on the first floor and has eight residential apartments on the second floor. The renovation plan is to add a third floor to make five two-story loft apartments and plans for commercial space on the first floor. This renovation will work to assist with the revitalization of the Town of Leonardtown downtown area. The cost to include an elevator in the project would cause the builder a financial hardship. The Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development is requesting review and comments regarding the waiver request. Comments must be received within twenty-one days, the administration will review the waiver documents and any comments received. The administration will make a determination if the waiver should be granted or denied. The commission discussed the project in detail. A motion was made to not support the request for waiver and comments will be sent to the administration relaying the commission's suggestions and was seconded, the motion passed.
